# Background – Feb. 8, 2010 Property Committee Report

- The 1988 Comprehensive Plan noted that many facilities were created in the 1920s and intended to serve a population of 6,000 (not the current population of 50,000)
- The Township requires 100% more space to house existing administrative personnel
- The Police Department requires 100% more space to house current personnel
- Public Works Yard structures are generally inadequate, up to 230 years old

## Background – June 13, 2011 Property Committee Report

- Final Recommendations included:
  - · Construction of new Public Works facility
  - Construction of a new Municipal Services Building behind the existing Police Station
  - Creation of a long-term plan for renovation and/or expansion of the existing Library; alternatively, identification and acquisition of a property for construction of a new Library

## **Update – Current Status**

- Commissioners have authorized construction of a new Public Works facility
- Initial planning has begun for construction of a new Township Municipal Services Building
- The condition of the library has deteriorated significantly, requiring the Property Committee to re-evaluate the future of the Library

## **Update - Current Library Status**

- · Mechanical, Electrical and Plumbing (MEP) systems are:
  - 30÷ years old
  - Inefficient
  - · At the end of their useful lives
- Emergency repairs are needed in basement relating to electrical and other systems
- · Facility not fully Building Code compliant
- · Facility not fully ADA-compliant
- · Facility has space deficiencies
- · Facility has limited parking and no safe drop-off zones

## **Library Options**


- Based upon the current Library status, the Property Committee unanimously believes that it will require a substantial cost to either repair or replace the facility, and these costs can no longer be ignored or deferred without placing the Library in jeopardy of closing

Regarding trash pickup – even if the township were to go to one day per week, tonnage is still the same and not going away. This issue has been discussed with the Public Works Director regarding selling half the fleet and what happens during snow weather?
